

Blaydon CC

Although cricket has been played in Blaydon since 1876 the club was formally formed in 1891. Blaydon won the Derwent Valley League three times before graduating through minor leagues to the Tyneside Senior League in 1972. In 2000 they were elected to the North East Premier League where they have twice finished third and last year came fourth when player-coach Allan Worthy scored 1,271 runs. The club's leading run scorer is Ian Somerville with 23,056 and Peter Carroll, the Club Secretary, tops the bowling charts with 1,353 wickets. West Indian Test pros have included Clyde Butts, who helped win three of four titles, 'Johnny' Perry, Jimmy Adams and Neil McGarrell. Mark Harper (Guyana) hit 3,013 (av. 101) in 1986 and Wes Thomas (Grenada) scored 215* and took all ten wickets in a match against Lintz in 1988 – a unique feat in Durham club cricket.

Broadstairs CC

Broadstairs Cricket Club has been established for over 100 years and in 2006 the first X1 gained promotion to the Kent County ECB Premier Division. The Club run three Saturday League sides, a Sunday team, mid-week team and also have a thriving colts section with teams at U15, U13, U11 and U9 level. Six of the current indoor squad are graduates of the club's youth programme and the club has recently achieved Clubmark accreditation.

Broadstairs return to the ECB National Indoor Finals at Lords for the fourth time in nine years, previously being Champions in 1998, Semi Finalists in 2001 and Runners Up in 2002. Four of the current team played in the previous three finals, although some have aged better than others!

Lutterworth CC

Lutterworth CC was founded in 1789 and is the 17th oldest cricket club in the country. Lutterworth is a market town in the South West corner of Leicestershire. The cricket ground is in the centre of the town surrounded by mature trees, with the parish church to one corner and a new pavilion built in 1997 in the other corner.

Lutterworth run 3 Saturday sides and 2 Sunday X1s, along with an evening league X1. Our junior sides consist of age groups 10s/11s/13s/15s/17s/ totaling about 75 youngsters.

Indoors Lutterworth's six-a-side squad has dominated the Leicestershire league for well over a decade, winning league and cup most seasons. Success indoors has been no surprise to our veteran club member Jeff Baxter as it was he who introduced Lutterworth to the six a side game some 15 years ago.

The last time Lutterworth reached the final at Lord's was in 1998 losing to Winchester CC. We are hoping that we will do better this time round. Whatever happens, we intend, along with our supporters, to enjoy the cricket and the day.

Sarisbury Athletic CC

Sarisbury Athletic CC was founded in the 1920's and plays in the Borough of Fareham in Hampshire. Currently the club fields 4 Saturday League teams, 1 on Sundays, 2 midweek teams and 4 colts' sides. We have over 200 members, 80 of them under 18. Our Saturday 1st X1 are currently playing Hampshire Cricket League Div.1 but every year we hope to break into the Southern Premier League.

The club qualified for Lord's by beating a string of Premiership sides including reigning National Champions BAT Sports plus 3 other past winners of the title. Our team at Lord's includes 5 players who have come up through the club's youth programme.
