

England Cricket Young Umpires Award (YUA) Costs & Criteria



The Young Umpire Award (YUA) is aimed at young people aged 14-25. The course is a combination of practical and theory sessions designed to equip the Young Umpire with the necessary skills and a qualification that will allow them to Umpire at local club level.

Following the completion of the award the Young Umpire will be directed towards their local club where they will start with low level games with the view to gain vital experience to move onto the Level 1 Umpire course.

Course Content: Roles and Responsibilities, Preparation, the Playing Area, Positioning and Signals, Methods of Dismissal, LBW, Extras and Injured Players.

The YUA is delivered by trained ECB ACO Tutors supported by a Tutor CD Rom resource. Each candidate will receive a resource pack including all ECB directive cards, a year's free membership to the ECB ACO, Law Book and the Young Umpires Workbook.
